











#### **The NMSU System Enrollment has Stabilized**


NMSU-System Fall Census Unduplicated Student Headcount


#### The NMSU-Las Cruces Fall Census Student Headcount has Stabilized













#### **Fall to Fall Retention**




#### **Four Year Graduation**



#### **Five Year Graduation**





#### Affordability – Student Net Price Average Student Now Pays Less than a Decade Ago



Community College Fall Census Headcount










# **Moving Forward: Social Mobility Index**




Research Expenditures in \$Millions



# 20% Compensation Increase by 2025








# 20% Compensation Increase by 2025

Average Full-Time Staff Salary





















